

When can I start driving...?



- First, after you turn 14, you can get an Instruction Permit by passing a written and vision test.
- Then, practice driving with a qualified adult for 40 hours, including 10 hours in inclement weather and darkness.
- Restriction: a qualified licensed driver must accompany all Instruction Permit drivers.
- Consequences: convictions for driving mistakes made while driving with an Instruction Permit will restart the six (6) months required.











What are the steps to getting a Provisional License and what is one...?



- First, you have to have an Instruction Permit and
 - Drive safely with an Instruction Permit for six (6) months and
 - Practicing driving with a qualified adult for 40 hours, including 10 hours in inclement weather and darkness.
- Then, when you turn 16, you can take the driving test for a Provisional License.
- **Restrictions:**
 - No passengers under 21 who aren't your siblings without a parent or guardian in the car and
 - No driving from 1:00 AM 5:00 AM unless for work
- Consequences: Convictions for driving mistakes will incur a \$200 penalty and 2 points on your driving record.

You just turned 18! What do you need for a full - unrestricted driver's license...?



- You must pass:
 - 1. the written knowledge test,
 - 2. a vision test, and
 - 3. a road test prior to being issued a driver's license
- Upon turning 21, your under-21 driver's license will expire in 90 days. You must then pass the Alcohol and Drug Awareness Knowledge Test.












When I have my provisional license, who can come with me when I'm driving...?



Are your passengers under 21? You may only drive alone with them if they are your siblings.

Passengers under 21, like your friends or peers, can only ride with you if you have a parent or guardian in the car.





Remember the time of day, too. Is it late at night? Drivers with provisional licenses may only drive between 1:00 AM and 5:00 AM if going to or from work.
